About the Seminar

The population of Nomadic communities in India is more than 10 crores. Even after 70 years of Independence of India, such a large population of these communities has to struggle to meet their basic needs of living. These Nomadic tribes can be classified as - i) Those which nomad along with their cattle in search of meadows. ii) Those which nomad because they don't have any specific resources for their living and hence, they have to leave places in search of livelihood & iii) Those which are known as Denotified Nomadic tribes. The tribes which opposed the British policies, were considered 'denotified tribes' by the British government, according to 'Criminal Tribes' Act of 1871. Even the tribes which used to steal away small things for their livelihood, also had been included in the list of 'denotified tribes. After the Independence of India, on 31 Aug. 1952, the 'Criminal Tribes Act of 1871' was cancelled. However these denotified tribes were confined inside the compound in 1960. Later on, they were freed and today are known as V.J.N.T.

A lot of Nomadic Tribes are still not the legal citizens of India. To obtain this citizenship, a lot of movements have taken place. These communities have been facing many acute problems. They are not held eligible to get the domicile certificate. They can not obtain ration cards, as they are not Indian citizens and due to all these, their names are not included in the voters' lists. Naturally, they remain distanced from facilities, such as, education, health care and employment. These are only basic problems. There are many more with which these communities have to struggle day in and day out. The astounding thing about the government's policy has been that no government has yet made any financial provision in annual budgets for the development of these communities.

Due to these grave issues, have been started reforms many movements (since 1871 to 1952) by to spell them out to awaken the governments from 1952 till the date, many justices and intellectuals have tried to voice out the problems of nomadics. Bhimrao Jadhav (Guruji), Mhopare (Guruji), Daulatrao Bhosale, Balkrishna Renake, Laxmanrao Gaikwad, Laxman Mane, Motiraj Rathod, Vasanttrao Chavan, Bhimrao Gasti, Haribhau Rathod, Asaram Jadhav(Guruji), Vyankappa Bhosale etc. have contributed immensely in holding agitations and marches for solving the problems of these communities. The consideration of problems of nomadic tribes began within the political circles after 2002 & thus, in consideration with their acute problems and the movements run by many thinkers, Shri Balkrishna Renake commission was appointed on 14th March 2005. This commission submitted its Report in 2008, but it was not accepted by the government. Hence on 19th Feb. 2014, another commission, under the presidentship of Bhiku Ramji Idate was established. The nomadic and V.J.N.T. communities have a lot of expectations from this commission.

The present National Seminar is expected to discuss many grave problems faced by the nomadic tribes and come to some solid conclusions and to suggest some remedies which, ultimately will help solve the problems.
